### **Continuing Medical Education (CME)**

#### **Step A: How to get started:**

1. Go to <https://vumc.cloud-cme.com>
  - a. Non-Vanderbilt learners: "Sign In" → "Non-Vanderbilt University Medical Center" → "Don't have an account?" → log in with your work email address
  - b. Vanderbilt learners: "Sign In" → "VUMC Faculty and Staff" → log in with your VUMC ID and password
2. Complete all profile fields and save
3. Make sure to complete the mobile number field to be able to text in for credit

#### **Step B: How to claim CME credit:**

1. Text in the code provided at time of each activity to **855-776-6263** (*code expires 24 hours after activity*)
2. Log in to your CloudCME account and go to Evaluations and Certificates
  - a. Select "My CE" → "Evaluations & Certificates" → "Complete Evaluation"
3. Complete the evaluation and download copy of certificate

### **Continuing Education Units (CEU)**

#### **In addition to Steps A and B above, instructions on how to claim CEU credit through NSGC:**

1. Submit a Category 2 CEU application through the NSGC CEU portal (<https://www.nsgc.org/page/ceuapproval>) including the following:
  - a. A certificate or transcript stating the number of contact hours earned for the activity, the date of the activity, and the accreditation body which approved the activity for continuing education
  - b. A flyer documenting the activity objectives, dates, session times and speakers (this should match and confirm the information submitted on the certificate and the session attendance grid)
  - c. Submit within 90 days after the end of each activity or on a quarterly basis if the activity is a series.
2. Pay the required \$25 filing fee for each activity application (fee required only once annually for series activity applications (see full details on the NSGC website)).
